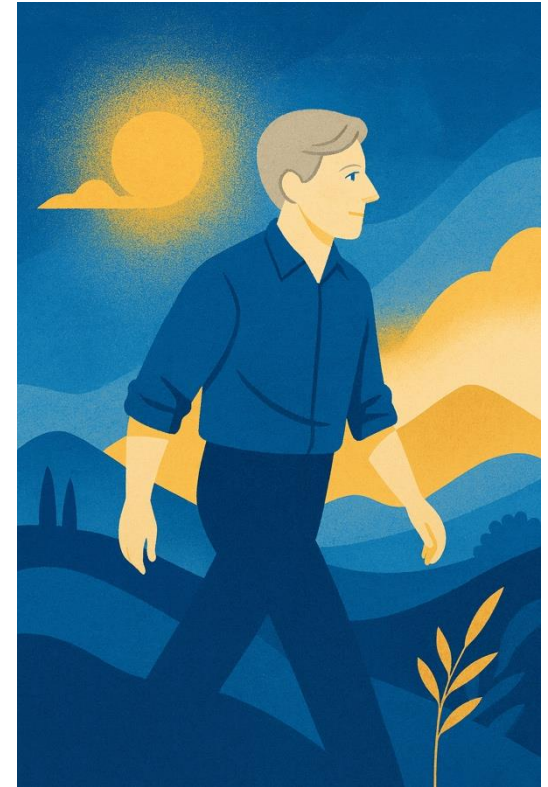
Who are we?

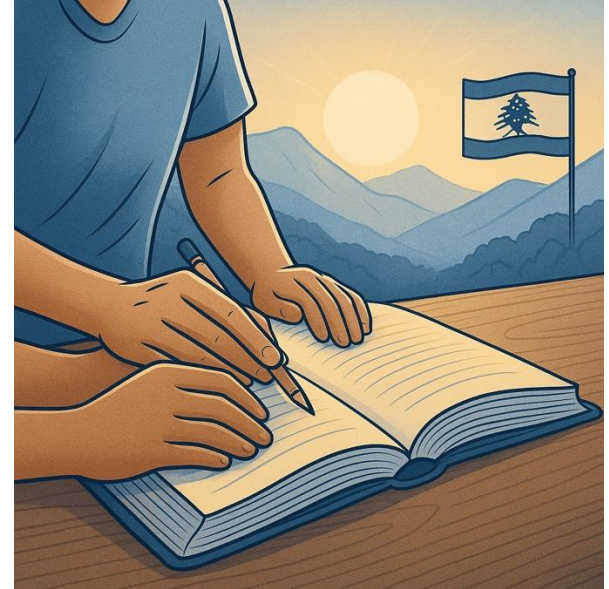
Mission & Vision

Why do we exist ?

Because a Lebanon without a strong middle class and solid education loses its future.

For whom?

We support children, young people, families, and schools at risk of educational exclusion.

We also support bright, ambitious youth with immense potential who dream of accessing top educational opportunities but are prevented from doing so due to financial constraints.

What impact do we seek?

To offer accessible, quality education for all and allow Lebanese talent to fully flourish in order to rebuild the country's future.



Our conviction: Preserving access to education means saving a generation — and the country's future.

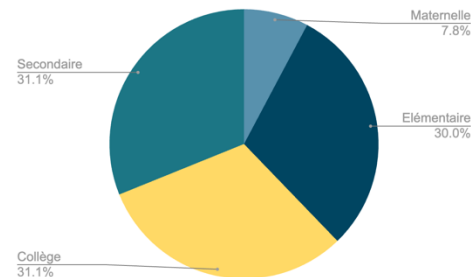
Key figures of our second year of activities

- 90 students supported with school fees
- 2 schools strengthened
- 0% dropout rate among scholarship recipients

Who are our scholarship students?

Our scholarship recipients are between 4 and 18 years old, come from North Lebanon, and represent a balanced sample of girls and boys (43/57).

Actions 2024-2025

- **School scholarships:** direct financial support to ensure continued schooling
- **Educational materials:** funding for books and learning tools
- **Cultural projects:** Christmas choir, Easter celebrations,
- **Educational facilities:** maintenance of the Happy Land park



Socioeconomic impact

- Essential support to **60 families** in North Lebanon
- Strengthened educational stability in **two schools** in Hasroun, North Lebanon
- Indirect impact on maintaining teachers' salaries
- Reduction of the risk of school dropout

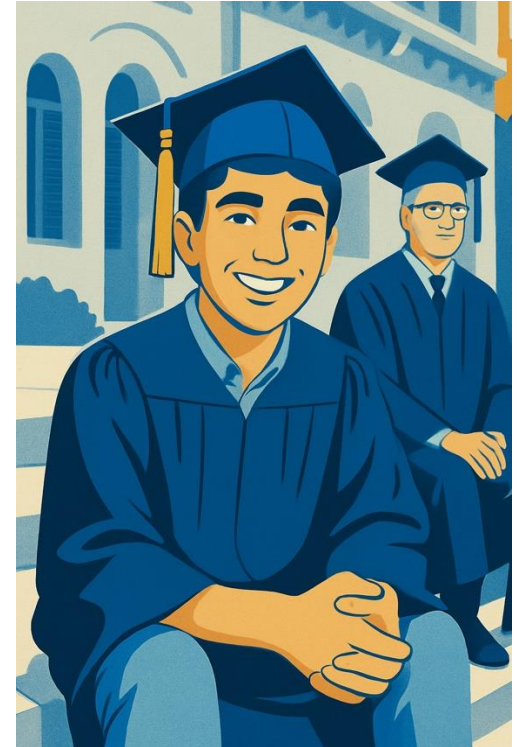
